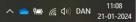














Al can be used for many different things

- Good usecases
 - Review of documents based on a specific training set
 - Translation
 - Summarisation
 - Contracts
 - Notes/minutes
 - Compilation/analysis of data/information
 - Creative production
- Bad usecases
 - Fact-finding (depending on the model) → hallucinations
 - Reason-based decision (logic reasoning)
 - Mathematical calculations







Risks...



Risks associated with the use of Al models

Special Al risks

Disclosure of information to third parties (confidentiality)

When training the AI foundation model, the supplier *may use* fine-tuning and prompt data and input for training purposes. In this way, business information is disclosed to third parties

Hallucinations and errors in generated responses (integrity)

The AI model can create output that is not correct as a result of errors in training data and algorithm conditions. These errors can have a significant impact on outputs or processes controlled by the model.

Bias in generated responses (integrity)

The AI model can create outputs that are not correct due to distortion in training data/training – if training data does not represent all relevant groups, situations or perspectives. These errors can have a significant impact on outputs generated or processes controlled by the model.

Black-box

Internal workflows are hidden or not clearly understandable to the user. This leads to a lack of transparency and transparency about how the model generates output or makes process decisions.

Intellectual Property

Many questions remain unanswered – ownership to input/output/prompts. Indented or unintended infringement. Training data. Data "memorization".

Possible reduction of risk

- Risk assessment/impact assessment and data/purpose classification to scale controls
- Solid Al governance model policies, processes and guidelines
- · Training of employees
- Contractual regulation of secondary training via business information.
- · Anonymisation checks
- Technical and organisational controls for fine tuning and prompt design (ban, anonymisation)
- · Check for training process in relation to model fine tuning
- · Check for prompt design
- · Check for output moderation
- Documentation and logging of training, prompting, output/decisions
